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#### **WELCOME BACK BUSY BEES!**

Welcome back to another year of service, advocacy, and excellence in education. As we begin this new school year together, I want to take a moment to reflect on what we've accomplished as a union, share important statewide updates, and reaffirm our commitment to our students, our members, and one another. Most importantly, I want to welcome you back, and say thank you. Thank you for your dedicated service to your students and our union.

Union Power: The Largest "Fix Tier 6" Rally in Suffolk County History

On October 6, educators and public employees from across Long Island filled the Suffolk Community College campus in Brentwood for the largest Tier 6 rally ever held in Suffolk County. The energy was electric—thousands of NYSUT members standing shoulder to shoulder, demanding fairness and retirement equity for all public servants. Through our collective efforts and continued advocacy, NYSUT has already secured major improvements to Tier 6, including:

- Reducing the Final Average Salary calculation from five years to three years, improving pension outcomes.
- Lowering the vesting period from ten years to five years, guaranteeing benefits for tens of thousands of educators.
- These victories belong to all of us—to every member who showed up, spoke up, and stood in solidarity. But our fight isn't over. We will continue to push for further reforms that ensure all educators, regardless of hire date, can retire with dignity and financial security.

#### AFT + First Book Grant: \$12,000 for Our Students!

I'm thrilled to share that our union was once again awarded a \$12,000 AFT "Reading Opens the World" Grant in partnership with First Book. This marks the second year in a row we've been recognized for our dedication to literacy and equity! Last year's grant provided new, high-quality books for our elementary programs. This year, we're expanding our reach to provide books for our middle and high school students, ensuring that all learners across our programs have access to engaging, age-appropriate literature that fosters curiosity, empathy, and lifelong learning. These grants highlight how our union's advocacy doesn't stop at contract tables—it extends directly to enriching the lives of our students and supporting our schools' educational missions.

#### Our Ongoing Commitment to Safety, Well-Being, and Dignity

#### National Changes: The Closing of the U.S. Department of Education

While details continue to unfold, this unprecedented move could have a significant impact on programs that support students with disabilities, including those we proudly serve across Eastern Suffolk BOCES. Programs funded under IDEA, Title I, and the Office for Civil Rights are vital to ensuring equitable services and legal protections for our most vulnerable learners. With federal oversight uncertain, our local advocacy and vigilance become more important than ever. We must ensure that students with disabilities continue to receive the high-quality education, support, and dignity they deserve—and that our staff are equipped with the resources and respect they need to deliver it. As your union, we will monitor this closely and advocate fiercely to protect both the rights of students and the working conditions of the professionals who serve them.

This year will bring challenges and opportunities alike. But as we've shown time and again, when we stand united—as advocates, as professionals, and as a union family—we can accomplish remarkable things.

Thank you for everything you do for our students, our programs, and our profession. I'm proud to lead alongside you, and I look forward to all that we will achieve together this year.

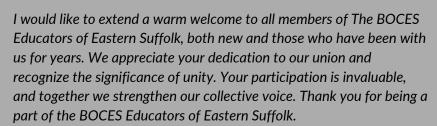

#### **BE SURE TO "PREP"**

Hello... BEES Membership! We had some unbelievable weather to start the school year. This last week though, the weather has started to change. The mornings are filled with that cool, crisp fall air. The seasonal change is upon us and Halloween is only a few weeks away. And, those holidays are right

around the corner! I hope everyone has settled into the school year and having a healthy start.

The Opening Day meeting was a little less than 2 months ago to kick off the start of the school year. The Annual Opening Day VOTE COPE Raffle was a big success and your union was able to raffle off gift cards to our VOTE COPE members. Your Union Leadership was able to stretch that money out an extra 24% in order to raffle off more gift cards to our members. 49 members were able to win a gift card. VOTECOPE is NYSUT's non-partisan action fund that coordinates the voluntary contributions of members and supports NYSUT-endorsed candidates and campaign committees that are pro-public education and pro-labor. Last year, NYSUT endorsed an equal amount of candidates from both parties. Thank you for being a member of VOTECOPE!



Election Day-Don't forget that Election Day is November 4<sup>th</sup>. Please go out and vote for your voice to be heard. I have always been told that national elections gain all the attention, but it's the local leaders that represent our interests in Albany and in Washington D.C. Annual Salary Notice-Every year, we check our salary notice (For both Blue & Yellow) to make sure we are being compensated with the correct salary and receiving the correct benefits. Most importantly, if you don't already do so, please make it a habit to check your biweekly paycheck on WinCap. It's our responsibility to make sure we are being compensated correctly and that you're aware of your deductions coming out of your paycheck. It's very easy with direct deposit to rely on your bank statement and not verify with WinCap. Also, you can, and should, check your personal leave, sick leave and accrued sick leave days on WinCap. I highly recommend that you print out and save a copy of your attendance record. Pension &; Retirement Education Program (PREP)-Below is a link to PREP. If you are a teacher or teacher assistant and planning on retiring anytime within the next few years, it is strongly recommended that check out the link below. I am honored to have been elected this past spring by my constituents to represent all of you and to serve on our Union Executive Board as Area Vice President of Itinerants/SAS. One of my roles is to provide you with the information you may need and to answer any questions you may have. Please feel free to reach out to me anytime. My contact information is below. When contacting any board member about union questions and concerns, please try to use our private emails (not BOCES email). I have also provided my office phone number as well. Also, members are reminded to register their own private email with the Union. This will be used when information is sent out to our members and will enable you to receive links to our meetings that are held in webinar format. As a Speech Language Pathologist, I know how important effective communication is in order to avoid misinformation and confusion. As previously mentioned, reach out to me with any concerns or questions. If I don't know the answer, I will get it for you. A more successful and united membership is my goal for all of us. And these are the first steps to take in order to make that happen.



Here are a few reminders for everyone as we begin another school year. Please keep current with your google schedules and make sure they are completed daily as they can be checked periodically. When updating your license, do not forget to send it to Jean Christensen. All updated licenses should be to her by April 1st in order to receive your stipend. You can always verify that Jean is in receipt of your license by asking her for a confirmation email.

Also, for those that are approved Medicaid providers, please be sure to search on eMedNY to ensure that you are currently enrolled and that your current address is on file in order to receive revalidation information. Members should also check their TEACH account to monitor certification status and interval dates and to ensure that the required Mandated Reporter training is reflected in your account.

Finally, your building representatives attend approximately five rep council meetings per year with the Executive Board members where they receive pertinent information in which they bring back to you, the members, following each meeting. Please try to attend the building meetings that are held by your reps. I will be coordinating with some reps around the agency to schedule a time when I can attend one of their building meetings. This will enable me to meet many of you face to face and to introduce myself. For those of you who are true itinerants out in district locations, I will join a zoom meeting held by your rep or you can call me at any time. I know it can be more difficult for those in outside locations to be able to make contact. Do not worry, you will not be forgotten. You can always make contact with myself or your rep with any questions or concerns.

#### APPLAUSE, APPLAUSE, APPLAUSE

Good day members,

I would first like to applaud all of the hard work of every single member, your work is appreciated. Welcome back to all of our returning and new members, we are happy to see you. I have some housekeeping items I would like to share with you:

- 1. Open enrollment begins in November. Any discrepancies in your care plan are showing up at this time. November is the time to adjust that.

  Whether it's approving a new medical plan or adjusting your FLEX benefit deductions, now is the time to do that. Be aware of what each plan offers, and look at the pros and cons of each for your individual or family needs.
- 2. Anticipate what your needs will be in the near future. I am sure you are seeing how quickly things turn around. Medical expenditures, dependent care and childcare have all increased.



- 3. You may be having financial difficulties due to rising prices. One way to free up some cashflow is to temporarily reduce contributions to your voluntary retirement accounts. Your 403 b or 507 type plans can be temporarily reduced to put those funds back into your paycheck. Be sure to increase your contributions again when you can afford to. Your union has also worked to make a Roth 403b option available to you as well as adding Vanguard to the list of 403b providers. If you feel comfortable, Vanguard offers the option to self manage your plan and avoid many overhead fees. Look out for a financial literacy workshop coming soon to our union office!
- 4. For many of us, the demands of today can cause anxiety and burnout. Take time to decompress if possible. Seek out friends and family to change the mood cycle. We have a great resource at Eastern Suffolk BOCES called the Employee Assistance Program. The program has a wide range of assistance from helping with small to medium tasks to counseling and referrals. If you find yourself in need, please ask for help. If you can offer assistance let the E.A.P. know also, this is a network style of assistance. Email eap@esboces.org. Please be assured that all matters are kept confidential.
- 5. For members who are struggling with serious financial difficulties and may find themselves without the daily necessities, a warm bed, food, and clothes, we also have the Employee Resource Foundation. This is another way for employees to confidentially get assitance with any immediate financial needs. You can find more information here <u>ERF</u>

#### Hello BEES Retirees

Here's a special welcome to our brand new class of 2024-25 retirees who are enjoying a first year of retiree chapter membership free!

I know some of you were able to join us at the annual complimentary RC22 (NYSUT Retiree Council 22) Fall Brunch at the Vineyards at Aquebogue held this year on September 30th- we had a great turnout of BEES retirees. It was a great social gathering, and we also learned about the negative financial impact of charter schools from our guest speaker Greg Wallace, the current President of the Riverhead Faculty Association.



It was also great to be a part of the huge FIX TIER SIX rally on October 6th at the Brentwood Community College Campus. Before I retired, I remember NYSUT working had to fix my punitive Tier Three, which developed into a much better Tier Four. So much better that I chose to retire under the terms of Tier Four instead of Tier Three. Over time, with our union lobbying, we hope Tiers Five and Six will be improved to resemble the excellent benefits we current retirees now enjoy. As you should be aware, none of our chapter dues go toward lobbying efforts- it is our separate Vote-Cope donations that are used for these political actions. If you have not yet made your donations to Vote-Cope, the easiest way to do that is by signing up for a Vote-Cope pension deduction so you can kick in some dollars every month without having to think about it. The form is available on the <a href="majorate">nysut.org</a> website. These funds keep our IRMAA reimbursements alive every year.

On Oct 15th in Melville and Oct16th in Riverhead, member retirees from all over Long Island participated in the annual all day Regional Conference sponsored by NYSUT. I would like to thank our BEES Executive Board for agreeing to my request to reimburse our BEES retirees for the cost of attending. This is one of the ways our chapter dues (which go directly into our BEES Union bank account) are used to support our retirees as well as our local. #### WHAT'S THIS ABOUT?

It's been over a decade since Tier 6 was added to the New York state pension

system. Since then, over 100,000 NYSUT members earn a significantly reduced pension as compared to earlier tiers. Consider this:

Tier 6 members pay 3 to 6 percent into the pension system their entire career — their contributions grow with pay raises.

Tier 4 member contributions are capped at 3 percent and end after 10 years.

Tior 6 members must work to age 63, up to 40 years of service, or face heavy penalties. Tier 4 members can retire at 55 with 30 years of service.

#### **30 YEARS IS A CAREER!**

Fixing Tier 6 is about keeping talented educators in the classroom and recruiting new educators into the profession.

A substantially reduced pension undervalues the education profession and is a major contributor to the teacher shortage. Our work is important. Our pensions should reflect that.



### THANKS TO OUR ADVOCACY, WE'VE ALREADY WON SOME PENSION IMPROVEMENTS.

In 2022, member vesting dropped from 10 to five years, guaranteeing a pension benefit for 85,000 Tier 6 members.

In 2024, we got the final average salary calculation changed from 5 years to 3 years. This means Tier 5 & 6 will get bigger pension checks, for life.

#### **HOW BAD IS IT?**



Tier 4 member, retiring at 55 with 30 years, would receive 60 percent of her Final Average Salary.



Tier 6 member, retiring at 55 with 30 years, would only receive 26.4 percent of his Final Average Salary — after paying tens of thousands more into the system.

#### WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

Fixing Tier 6 is about solidarity and fairness.

It's unfair that some educators and public workers must work longer, and contribute more, to earn a significantly reduced pension.

#### Fixing Tier 6 is about dignity.

The hallmark of a public-service career is the promise of a dignified retirement. With Tier 6, the state abandons its commitment to that guarantee.
